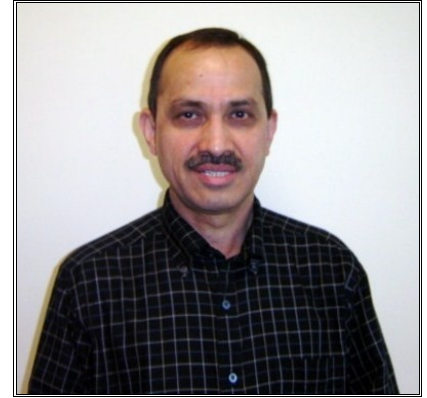


Hussain A. Khawaja, MD

Dr. Khawaja received his medical degree from Sindh Medical College in Karachi, Pakistan in 1983. He then did an internship at Jinnah Post Graduate Medical Center in Internal Medicine and General Surgery from 1983-1984 and a residency at Charania Hospital in Karachi, Pakistan from 1984-1988 and Upstate Medical Center in Syracuse, NY from 1998-2001. Dr. Khawaja completed several fellowships: Non-Invasive Cardiology in 2004 at Rancho Los Amigos Medical Center in Downey, CA; Cardiology at Albany Medical Center in 2009; and Interventional Cardiology at Albany Medical Center in 2010.
